GRACE ALONE

- Grace is the unmerited favor of God by which we are saved.
- It cannot be earned or repaid but it can and should be reflected.
- God saturated this Christian walk with grace for forgiveness, restoration, inspiration and endurance.

GRACEALONE

- Grace Alone was the Reformers cry against the teaching of works based redemption!
- · It is a relevant issue still.
- Matthew 20, the parable of the workers is an informative parable on God's Grace.



11THHOUR I. The Grace of the Master

- Day workers are sought out and hired, especially during harvest, to work with the household of the Master on his property.
- The Master goes out all through the day looking for workers! #grace

11TH HOUR II. The Grace of the Hire

- Employment by the Master parallels service in the Kingdom.
- · Covenant (agreement) parallels the arrangement but compensation does not.
- "What is right," is an integral part of the parable.
- They work for payment we work because of payment.

11TH HOUR II. The Grace of the Hire

- The workers, like us, are prone to entitlement and deservedness!
- The workers, like us, are powerless to effect the Master's will!

11TH HOUR III. The Grace of a Gift

- The denarius was the usual wage of a day laborer.
- · It could provide the basics for a family.
- It represents the goodness of the master. #abundance



11TH HOUR III. The Grace of a Gift

- The pay at the last is the same as the first revealing a purpose beyond increased resources.
- The transaction was not about income but inclusion!
- The Master was good to the early and the late by saving them from idleness, uselessness and rejection.
